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

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
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Executive Director Stacy Rhodes

Is Your Squad in "Good Standing?"

O ne of the first steps to becoming a rescue squad or fire department is to obtain a corporate charter. This is obtained by filing your organizational documents with the Tennessee Secretary of State. Following incorporation, one of the next stes is to apply for exemption from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. These are important steps in getting started on the right foot.

Additionally there are two other annual events that are critical. Once you obtain your charter you are required to file an annual report with the Secretary of State, generally by April 1 of each year. This one page form asks for the names and addresses of your officers and board of directors and requires the payment of an annual fee of \$20. Failure to file this form can have serious and undesired consequences.

First failure to file will result in the Administrative Dissolution of your Charter. Once your squad has been administratively dissolved your name is no longer reserved. This means someone else could file a new charter using your name and you would no longer have it available. If your charter has been dissolved you are no longer considered a corporation and thus not a separate legal entity. Your squad would be operating as a group of individuals. So if someone sued your squad, it is likely you would be sued as individuals and not as a corporation. So the costs of litigation and the payment of any judgment would be a person liability of your members and officers. Also your insurance coverage could be questioned since the insured party no longer legally exists.

You can check the status of your charter by logging into the Tennessee Secretary of State website and looking up your organization. (http://tnbear.tn.gov/ ECommerce/FilingSearch.aspx or www.state.tn.us/sos/) If you find that you have been administratively dissolved, you should contact the Secretary of State by calling (615) 741-2078 and request all delinquent annual reports and corporate reinstatement forms and file them immediately. This should get you back in good standing.

Secondly you are required to file an annual report with the Internal Revenue Service. There have been recent changes in the past year for those squads whose annual receipts are less than \$25,000. Before the recent changes you were not required to file an annual report. Now all not-for-profit organizations have an annual filing requirement.

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When 911 has an EMERGENCY!

On Friday June 11th Cocke County E-911 had an Emergency of its own. When the female caller dialed 911 needing an ambulance, she knew that she would get the help that she needed for her Mother who was having a heart attack.

But on that day we had a problem, Allied EMS our primary Ambulance provider was at Level 0, which means they have no ambulance available, Cocke County Ambulance Service was also unavailable. Dispatch contacted the Newport Rescue Squad who had a driver but no EMT. Cosby Volunteer Fire Department had an EMT but no Ambulance. By this time the daughter has called a second time, screaming and begging the Dispatcher to help her. We contacted the Rescue

Squad and the EMT from Cosby Fire and coordinated a response. The EMT would be in route to the scene in his personal vehicle and the Rescue Squad would respond with an ambulance to meet him there, as per their protocol this meant they would be running as out of service with no lights and siren. When the EMT arrived on the scene the female was unresponsive, He too is now on his radio needing help. The Rescue Squad gets to the scene assists with the patient and transports her and the EMT to our local Hospital where she is stabilized and transported to



Knoxville via medical helicopter, where she is expected to make a full recovery. When people call 911 they expect us to get them the help they need. But as you see sometimes it's just not that simple! We are all required to have these policies and procedures in place but emergencies never follow our plans. Had it not been for Ronnie Webb with the Newport Rescue Squad and EMT Chris Gregg with the Cosby Volunteer Fire Department, the events of that day would have been tragically different. Because you see, That patient died that day ! And these two VOLUNTEERS brought her back and saved her life. Because that's what they do, they protect us and take care for us when we need them most.

If your annual gross receipts are generally less than \$25,000 you must file a post card return. This filing is done electronically via the internet at <u>www.irs.gov</u>. If your squad's annual gross receipts are generally more than \$25,000 and less than \$100,000 you must file Form 990-EZ. If your annual gross receipts exceed \$100,000 you must file Form 990. All of these forms have been revised lately. The filings are due by the 15th day of the 5th month following your year end. So if your year ends on December 31, your filing is due by May 15 of each year.

Failure to timely file these forms with the IRS can have bad consequences as well. Generally the following will occur:

- You will be charged a penalty of \$10 per day for each day your return is late. If the failure to timely file is willful it can be increased to \$20 per day. This fee is assessed against your squad and an equal penalty can be assessed against any person or persons responsible to making sure the filings are made.
- If you fail to file for two years, your tax exempt status is revoked. This means you are no longer exempt from the payment of federal taxes, donations to your squad are not tax deductible and if you desire to get your exemption back, you must reapply and pay additional fees. Some organizations have had to contact individuals and organizations who have made deductible donations and advise them of the loss of their tax exempt status. And some donors have requested the organization to return their money.

So failure to timely satisfy the filing requirements can have devastating consequences. If you find that you have failed to comply with the filing requirements you should file all delinquent returns and when the penalties are assessed, you should ask they be abated. Most organizations have been successful if they have a good reason for failing to file. However, you generally only have one opportunity at getting the penalties abated. So it is important to keep your squad in "good standing."
